





Bicycles in England

THE Canadian Press Association in a recent dispatch from London, says:

"Although the number of motorcars in Great Britain is increasing at the rate of almost 100,000 a year, the ordinary bicycle, is still the preeminent wheeled means of locomotion on the reads of the country. It is estimated that between 9,000,-000 and 10,000,000 bicycles still are in use, including thousands of tandems and quite a few tricycles. The tandems and tricycles are generally given an airing Sundays and bank holidays.

"Oxford and Cambridge probably boast more bicycles than any other community, taking population into consideration, for the reason that they are largely used by the students of those two universities. The same sort of attached basket which housewives and delivery boys use elsewhere to carry meat and vegetables are used in the two university towns by the students to carry the classics.

"With the drop in the price of small cars has come a falling off in the number of motorcycles. There were 6,979 fewer of these mechanically propelled means of locomotion on the road in 1930 than in 1929.

"The total number of automobiles. motorcycles, goods vehicles and motor hackneys (cars plying for hire) on the roads in 1930 was 2,287,325, only a ninth or tenth of the mechanically propelled traffic to be encountered on American roads. But as against the 120,000,000 population of the United States must be reckoned the 44,000,000 in this country.

Sidecar for Bicycles

THE Central Aircraft and Supply Co., I lowa City, Ia., has introduced to the trade a practical sidecar for the bicycle.

The new member of the cycle field is called the Pal-Car and can be used for carrying packages, newspapers or a pal.

It can be attached and detached from the bicycle easily and rapidly. The Pal-Car weight is 18 pounds and the weight is suspended so that it is equally distributed and is attached to the bicycle frame by rubber lined attachments.

Engineers of the company claim that the Pal-Car is far more easier to handle than previous cycle sidecars, which formerly were modeled a la motorcycle side-

Andre J. Michelin

NDRE JULES MICHELIN, French tire manufacturer, sportsman and philanthropist, died at Paris on April 4 at 78 years of age. Mr. Michelin, with his brother, Edward, started with the manufacture of bicycle tires in 1888, founding the Michelin Tire Company that year. He has remained as the company's commercial director. commercial director.

He was a leading figure in the auto-mobile industry in France and was also interested in the development of aviation, donating the Michelin Cup for aviation contests and at one time was president of the Aero Club of France. The company maintained a factory at New Brunswick, N. J., but that was closed last September.


M. Michelin was born in Paris on Jan. 16, 1853, and was educated as a civil engineer. He married a Mlle. Wolff. His tire factory was at Clermont-Ferrand, capital of the department of Puy-de-Dome. -

He was a chevalier of the Legion d'Honneur, Officer d'Academie and honorary president of the Aero Club of France.
